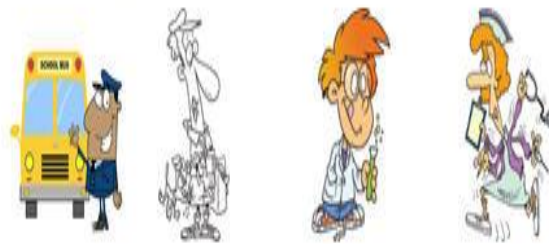

A Job Interview

When you are in the actual interview answer the questions clearly and directly and, if there is something you do not understand, ask them to repeat the question instead of giving the wrong answer.
