

<b>ZERO conditional</b>	If you stand in the rain, If you heat ice,		you get wet. it melts.
	PRESENT SIMPLE	+	PRESENT SIMPLE
<b>USES:</b>	<i>Facts which are generally true or scientific facts The condition always has the same result</i>		
<b>FIRST conditional</b>	If it rains, If you study,		we will cancel the trip. you will pass the exam.
	PRESENT SIMPLE	+	WILL / WON'T + VERB
<b>USES:</b>	<i>A possible situation in the future Predicting a likely result in the future (if the condition happens)</i>		
<b>SECOND conditional</b>	If I won the lottery, If they sold their house,		I would travel a lot. they would be rich.
	PAST SIMPLE	+	WOULD + VERB
<b>USES:</b>	<i>Hypothetical or unlikely situations Unreal or improbable situation now or in the future</i>		
<b>THIRD conditional</b>	If you had studied, If I hadn't been sick,		you would have passed the exam. I would have gone to your party.
	PAST PERFECT	+	WOULD HAVE + PAST PARTICIPLE
<b>USES:</b>	<i>The person is imagining a different past Imaginary situation that did not happen</i>
